WHAT IS HUNTINGTON'S DISEASE?

Huntington's disease (HD) is a genetic disorder that causes the progressive breakdown of nerve cells in the brain. It deteriorates a person's physical and mental abilities usually during their prime working years, and is ultimately fatal. HD manifests as a triad of motor, cognitive, and psychiatric symptoms, which progressively get worse over time.

The symptoms of HD are often described as having ALS, Parkinson's and Alzheimer's diseases – simultaneously. HD symptoms can vary a lot from person to person, but they usually include:

- Personality changes, mood swings & depression
- Forgetfulness & impaired judgment
- Unsteady gait & involuntary movements (chorea)
- Slurred speech, difficulty in swallowing & significant weight loss

Every child of a parent with HD has a 50/50 chance of inheriting the faulty gene that causes the disease.

Today, there are approximately 41,000 symptomatic Americans, or those that show signs of having HD. 200,000 people in the United States are at-risk of inheriting HD.

In less than 10% of cases, juvenile Huntington's disease (JHD) affects children & adolescents. JHD usually has a more rapid progression rate than adult onset HD; the earlier the onset, the faster JHD progresses. Death often occurs within 10 years of JHD onset, as opposed to 10-25 years in adult onset HD.

There is no cure for HD...yet!
